Scrabble History

During the Great Depression, an out-of-work architect [1] n_____ Alfred Mosher Butts decided to invent a [2] b_____ game. Butts wanted to create a game that combined the vocabulary skills of crossword puzzles and anagrams, with the additional element of chance. The game was originally named Lexico, but Butts [5] e_____ decided to call the game "Criss-Cross Words." Butts studied the front page of The New York Times to calculate how often each of the 26 letters of the English language was used. He discovered that vowels appear far more often than [6] c_____, with E being the most frequently used vowel. After figuring out [7] f_____ of use, Butts assigned different point values to each letter decided how many of each letter would be included in the game. The letter S posed a problem. While it's frequently used, Butts decided to include only four S's in the game, hoping to limit the use of plurals. [8] A_____ all, he didn't want the game to be too easy! Butts got it just right. Butts' first attempts to sell his game to established game manufacturers were [9] f_____, but he didn't give up. He and his partner, game-loving entrepreneur James Brunot, refined the rules and design of the game, and renamed it SCRABBLE. The name, which [10] m_____ "to grope frantically," was trademarked in 1948. The first SCRABBLE "factory" was an abandoned schoolhouse in Dodginton, Connecticut, where Brunot and friends turned out 12 games an hour. The letters were stamped on wooden tiles one at a time. Later, boards, boxes and tiles were made elsewhere and sent to the factory for assembly and shipping. The first four years were a struggle...
